LAPEROUSE MUSEUM

The Laperouse Museum is located in the historic Cable Station building on La Perouse Headland, on the northern shore of Botany Bay and provides a detailed account of the 1785 – 1788 scientific expedition to the Pacific, commanded by French Navigator, Jean-Francois de Galaup, Comte de Laperouse who arrived at Botany Bay on the 26th January 1788 to observe the activities of the British.

After 6 weeks the expedition with its two ships Astrolabe & Boussole departed from Botany Bay on 10th March 1788 never to be seen again. In 1827 wreckage from the ships was located in the Solomon Islands and the research of the site continues to the present day. Objects recovered from the wrecks are featured in the Laperouse Museum.

The story is ongoing!

The Museum was developed as a joint Franco – Australian Project, conceived by the Laperouse Association for the Australian Bicentenary, whose voluntary effort and dedication secured the investment of several million dollars in corporate and individual sponsorships to establish the Museum which was officially opened on 23rd February, 1988.

Subsequently, the Laperouse Association was reconstituted as the Friends of the Laperouse Museum to maintain ongoing community support for the Museum and its activities.

PÈRE RECEVEUR GRAVE

Père Receveur, a Franciscan Friar, was both chaplain and naturalist onboard the expedition. He died at Botany Bay on 17th February, 1788 and a tomb now marks his grave site.

LAPEROUSE MONUMENT

In September, 1825 Hyacinth de Bougainville laid the foundation stone for a monument which he commissioned on the site to commemorate the visit of Laperouse to Australia. Both the monument and Receveur's tomb are attributed to Bougainville and were completed in 1828.

La Perouse Headland is held with great affection by the Australian Community, the French Community in Australia, French and other International Visitors, for the history it represents and the link it provides with the people of many nations.
